



- Sign languages are based on movements
- A script for sign languages needs to be based on movements
- SignWriting, ISO-15924 Sgnw, is the only script generally used for writing sign languages
- SignWriting has been developed over the last 30+ years.
- The latest achievement is software that allows for writing sign languages grammatically correct



- Without a script a culture has no history
- A script for sign languages will emancipate cultures and allows for the writing of a history
- SignWriting has progressed from a script that was only written by hand to a script that is supported on computers
- Newspapers and novels have been written
- The acceptance that sign languages can be written is growing



- There is no UNICODE support yet
- There are over 30.000 characters
- There is a request for an American Sign Language Wikipedia
- There is a pent up demand for tools that support sign languages
- Many more sign languages will become known
